

## Income

### Christians in Action

#### Emergency Material & Financial Assistance

- Households served in 2008 = 3,110.
- 1,506 individuals received material assistance for clothing, appliances, household goods or furniture.
- 6,126 individuals received financial assistance for transportation, utilities, food, prescriptions, rent or other needed services.

### Concho Valley Workforce Development Board

#### CARES (Children At-Risk Enrollment Services)

- Parents receiving subsidized day care in 2008 = 42.
- Children enrolled in the CARES program in 2008 = 43.
- 100% of the participating families were able to work full-time and financially support their families
- 100% of the participating children were able to attend a quality child care program and work toward developmental goals.

### Institute for Cognitive Development

#### NewBridge Family Shelter

- Adults and children served in 2008 = 406.
- 100% of the adults and children were kept safe from harm.
- 100% of children attended school regularly.
- 30% of adults obtained employment.
- 54% of adults obtained permanent housing.
- 55% of adults increased their income levels.
- 75% of adults and children participated in a counseling program.

## Income

### Rebuilding Together

#### Handyman Program

- Homeowners served in 2008 = 145.
- 100% of homeowners received significant home improvement.
- 100% of homeowners were able to stay in their homes and remain independent.

### The Salvation Army

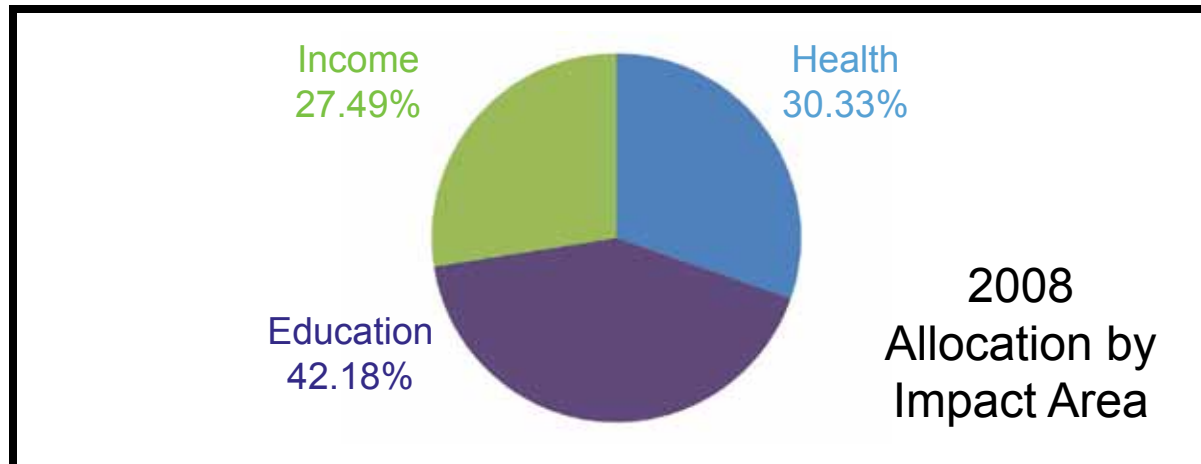
#### Emergency Assistance Program

- Family and individual cases served in 2008 = 1,698.
- 3,277 nights lodging and 31,888 meals were provided through the Red Shield Lodge in 2008.

### YMCA

#### KidSafe Elementary After School Program

- Children served in 2008 = 125.
- 100% received affordable after school care.
- 100% were kept safe from harm.
- 100% were provided with homework assistance.
- 100% of the parents were able to continue with full-time employment or education.

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## Health

### Adult Enrichment Center

#### *Nursing and Personal Care Program*

- Adults served in 2008 = 125.
- 95% of adults attending were able to continue to live where he or she chose and were not institutionalized.
- 95% of the caregivers and families said they were less stressed.
- 100% of the caregivers had more time to attend to other family members and were able to work outside the home.
- 75% of adults attending improved their health or were at their best possible health for their age.

### Alcohol and Drug Abuse Council for the Concho Valley

#### *Adult Treatment*

- Adults served in 2008 = 450
- 86% of women admitted to the residential treatment program completed the program successfully.
- 78% of men admitted to the residential treatment program completed the program successfully.
- 37% of men and women admitted to the outpatient program completed the program successfully.

### Children's Advocacy Center

#### *Project Healing Feelings*

- Children served in 2008 = 615
- 98.8% of the children assisted in the past five years have found permanent homes and are safe from further abuse and neglect.
- 1.2% of the children were returned to the program for services.



## Health

### Concho Valley Home for Girls

#### *Children's Emergency Shelter Safe and Sound Program*

- Children served in 2008 = 89.
- 100% of the children were safe, and those who could talk said they felt safe.
- 100% of the children's physical needs were met.
- 70% of the older children were able to express understanding of their situation and recognize their families' problems.
- 100% of the children progressed in developmental skill acquisition.

### Concho Valley Regional Food Bank

#### *Hunger Relief Program*

- 1,259,150 pounds of food were distributed throughout the Concho Valley.
- 854,707 meals were prepared from the food distributed throughout the Concho Valley.
- 102,164 children under age 12 received food.
- 44,298 adults over the age of 65 received food.
- 105 agencies throughout the Concho Valley received food from the Concho Valley Regional Food Bank.

### Esperanza Health & Dental Centers

#### *Success by 6 Program*

- Teen parents receiving intensive case management = 30.
- 100% of teens enrolled received ongoing prenatal care.
- 100% of teens had full-term pregnancies.
- 100% of babies born to teen parents were healthy.
- 100% of babies born to teen parents enrolled in the program are achieving developmental milestones.
- 100% of teen parents enrolled in the program are enrolled in school and moving toward self-sufficiency.

## Education

### Adult Literacy Council

#### *English as a Second Language*

- Adults served in 2008 = 168.
- 52% of participating adults learned how to read, write and speak fluently in English.
- 72% of participating adults learned how to read and speak Basic English.

### Big Brothers Big Sisters

#### *Lunch Buddies*

- Children served in 2008 = 106.
- 70% of children demonstrated an ability to make good decisions, express feelings, show self-confidence and have a sense of future.
- 58% demonstrated an ability to achieve in the classroom, maintained good classroom behavior, participated in class, avoided delinquency behaviors and had a good attitude.
- 71% of children demonstrated trust and respect for people in their lives and had good relationships with adults, peers, and family.

### Boys and Girls Club of San Angelo

#### *Career and Education Development Program*

- Children served in 2008 = 850.
- 86% of the children attending this program improved their grades and academic ability.
- 73% of the children attending this program attended school regularly and assumed responsibility for their own educational success or failure.
- 29% of the children attending this program improved their attendance record.
- 83% of high school seniors who attended this program graduated from high school.

### Concho Valley Council, Boy Scouts of America

#### *Youth Development Through Cub Scouts Program*

- Cub Scouts served in 2008 = 1,941.
- 45.8% of the Cub Scouts were recognized for their successes.
- 100% of the children participating were encouraged to spend quality time with their families.
- 100% learned protection skills to prevent child abuse.
- 100% learned citizenship skills by participating in community service.

## Education

### Concho Valley Home for Girls

#### *Independent Living Skills Program*

- Children served in 2008 = 23.
- 99% of the girls showed improvement in school both in academics and behavior.
- 95% of the girls were involved in community activities and showed marked improvement over the year.
- 90% of the girls made progress addressing issues that have had a negative impact on their lives and are working toward solutions.

### Concho Valley Rape Crisis Center

#### *Education and Prevention Program*

- Children and adults served in 2008 = 3,050.
- 89% of youth attending training demonstrated an increase in knowledge to identify risk factors between healthy and unhealthy relationships and being able to identify bullying and sexual harassment.
- 100% of professionals attending training demonstrated an increase in knowledge to identify risk factors that allow sexual assault or sexual violence to occur.
- 100% of program participants demonstrated knowledge in being able to identify risk factors that allow sexual assault and/or sexual violence to occur.

### Girl Scouts of Central Texas

#### *SISTERS (Stay in School to Enjoy Real Success)*

- Girls enrolled in the SISTERS program in 2008 = 432.
- 33% of the girls participating in the elementary program also enrolled in junior high school.
- 63% of the girls were able to identify their academic strength.
- 66% of the girls were able to set life goals including staying in school and post-secondary education.
- 83% of the girls reported their grades have improved in school.

### San Angelo Day Nursery

#### *Infant, Toddler and Pre-K Program*

- Children served in 2008 = 200.
- 100% progressed in the developmental skills necessary for Kindergarten.
- 100% were able to thrive in a safe, loving, and educational environment.
- 100% of the parents were able to further their education or succeed in their job.
- 100% of the children enrolled improved their language skills.
