UNITED WAY NAMES NEW LOCAL LEADERS

United Way of the Concho Valley's volunteer leadership passed the torch to a new set of volunteer leaders, who will guide the direction of the organization in 2010.

Chuck Shore, Senior Vice President of First Financial Bank San Angelo, replaces David Harrison of Texas Bank as Chair of the Board of Directors. "I feel very honored," Shore said. "The United Way is truly a great organization because it works to address and improve the community as a whole. It's amazing to realize the impact United Way can make with campaign dollars," said Shore.

For the first time ever, four individuals will jointly share the duties of Campaign Chair. They are Colonel Charlie Powell Chair of Wells Fargo Bank Community Bank Board, who was the 1985 Campaign Chair and the first to ever raise over \$1,000,000; Fred Key, President of Foster Communications, who served as the Campaign Chair in 2001 and raised \$2,496,162 which was the highest amount of money raised in the history of the United Way; Jay Michaels, Vice President/General Manager of Foster Communications, who served as Campaign Chair in 2003 and raised a total of \$2,475,436 and last year's Campaign Chair Shelley Burnett of Atmos Energy, who raised \$2,107,014. The four of them together have raised more than \$8,000,000 for the United Way. The campaign kickoff will be held in late summer.
